## EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 047-2019

### AN ORDER RECONSTITUTING THE MUNICIPAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL (MDRRMC) OF PINAMALAYAN, ORIENTAL MINDORO, DEFINING ITS FUNCTIONS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

**Whereas**, the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 (RA 10121) declares that it is the State's policy to address the root cause of vulnerability to disaster by gathering the institutional capacity for disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM) and building resilience of communities to disasters and climate change;

**WHEREAS**, in order to uphold the people's constitutional rights to life and property, there is a need to address the root causes of vulnerabilities to disasters, strengthening the country's institutional capacity for disaster risk reduction and management and building the resilience of local communities to disasters including climate change impacts;

**WHEREAS**, there is a dire need to reorganize the MDRRMC due to end of term/change/transfer of work assignment of other members to make it more effective and proficient in dispensing its duties and functions to the citizenry of Pinamalayan for the prevention and reduction of the possible effect of natural and man-made disasters and providing supports and aids during the time of adversity.

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, **ARISTEO A. BALDOS, JR.**, Municipal Mayor by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the reconstitution of Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council of Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro as follows;

**SECTION 1. SCOPE.** The Executive Order provides for the development of policies and plans and the implementation of action and measures pertaining to all aspects of disaster risk reduction and management, including good governance, risk assessment and early warning, knowledge building and awareness raising, reducing underlying risk factor, and preparedness for effective response and early recovery.

**SECTION 2. COMPOSITION.** The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council is hereby reorganized to be composed of the following;

**SECTION 2. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS.** The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council shall perform the following duties and functions:

- (1) Approve, monitor and evaluate the implementation of the Municipal DRRM Plans and regularly review and test the plan consistent with other national and local planning programs;
- (2) Ensure the integration and disaster risk reduction and climate change adaption into local development plans, programs and budgets as a strategy in sustainable development and poverty reduction;
- (3) Recommend the implementation of force or preemptive evacuation of local residents, if necessary; and
- (4) Convene the local council once every three months or as necessary.

**SECTION 3. Accreditation, Mobilization, and Protection of Disaster Volunteer National Service Reserve Corps, CSOs and the Private Sector.** The Municipal Government may mobilize individuals or organized volunteers to augment their respective personnel complement and logistical requirements in the delivery of disaster risk reduction programs and activities. The municipal government shall take full responsibility for the enhancement, welfare and protection of volunteers, and shall submit the list of volunteers to the OCD, through the Local DRRM Office, for accreditation and inclusion in the database of community disaster volunteers. Accreditation shall be done at the municipal level.

Mobilization of volunteers shall be in accordance with the guidelines to be formulated by the National Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council consistent with the provision of RA 10121, Any volunteer who incurs death or injury while engaged in any of the activities defined under the Act shall be entitled to compensatory benefits and individual personnel accident insurance as may be defined under the guidelines.

**SECTION 4. Integration of Disaster Risk Reduction Education into the School Curricula and Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Program sa and Mandatory Training for the Public Sector Employees.** The DepEd, CHED, TESDA, in coordination with OCD, the National Youth Commission (NYC), the DOST, the DENR, the DILG, the BFP, the DOH,

The DSWD and other relevant agencies, shall integrate disaster risk reduction and management education in the school curricula of secondary and tertiary level of education, including National Service Training Program, (NSTP), whether private or public, including formal and non-formal, technical vocational, indigenous learning, and out-of-school youth courses and programs.



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The Local DRRM Council, the Local DRRM Office, the Barangay Disaster Coordinating Committees and Sanguniang Kabataan shall encourage community, specifically youth, participation in the disaster risk reduction and management activities, such as organizing quick response groups, particularly in identified disaster-prone areas, as well as the inclusion of disaster risk reduction and management programs as part of the SK programs and projects.

The public sector employees shall be trained in emergency response and preparedness. The training is mandatory for such employees for such employees to comply with the provision of RA 10121.

**SECTION 5. *Coordination During Emergencies.*** The municipal DRRM Council shall take the lead in the preparing for, responding to, and recovering from the effect of the disaster when two (2) or more barangays are affected;

**SECTION 6. *Declaration of State of Calamity.*** The declaration and lifting of the state of calamity may also be issued by the local Sanggunian, upon the recommendation of the Municipal DRRM Council, based on the results of the damage assessment and needs analysis.

**SECTION 7. *Remedial Measures.*** The declaration of the calamity shall make mandatory the immediate undertaking of the following remedial measures by the member-offices/agencies concerned as defined in R.A 10121;

- (a) Imposition of price ceiling on basic necessities and prime commodities by the President upon recommendation of the Implementing Agency as provided for under Republic Act 7581, otherwise known as the Price Act or the National Price coordinating Council;
- (b) Monitoring, prevention and control by the Local Price Coordination Council of overpricing/profitteering and hoarding of prime commodities, medicines, and petroleum products;p
- (c) Programming/ reprogramming of funds for the repair and safety upgrading of public infrastructure and facilities; and
- (d) Granting of no-interest loans by government financing or lending institutions to the most affected section of the population through their cooperative or people's organization.

**SECTION 8. *Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council Secretariat-*** The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO) shall serve as the Secretariat of the Council headed by **MR. DANIEL Q. FRUELDA**, LDRRO II. The Secretariat shall assist the Council in the exercise of its functions like the recording of its proceedings, transcribing the records of the proceedings, preparation and furnishing of notices, orders, and other processes to the interested parties, and performing such other incidental and inherent administrative functions.

**SECTION 9. *Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund.-*** The present Calamity Fund shall henceforth be known as the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund. Not less than five percent (5%) of the estimated revenue from regular sources shall be set aside as the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund to support disaster risk management activities such as, but not limited to, pre-disaster preparedness programs including training, purchasing life-saving rescue equipment, supplies and medicines, for post-disaster activities, and for the payment of premiums on calamity insurance the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council shall monitor and evaluate the use and disbursement of the Municipal DRRM Fund based on the Municipal DRRM Plan as incorporated in the local development plans and annual work and financial plan.

Upon the recommendation of the Municipal DRRM Officer and approval of the Sanggunian, the Municipal DRRM Council may transfer the said fund to support disaster risk reduction work of other Municipal DRRM which is declared under state of calamity.

Of the amount appropriated for the Municipal DRRM Fund, thirty percent (30%) shall be allocated as Quick Response Fund (QRF) or Stand-by fund for relief and recovery programs in order that situation and living conditions of people in communities or areas stricken by disasters, calamities, epidemics, or complex emergencies, may be normalized as quickly as possible.



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The Unexpected Municipal DRRM Fund shall accrue to a special trust fund solely for the purposes of supporting disaster risk reduction and management activities of the Local DRRM Council within the next (5) years. Any such amount still not fully utilized after (5) years shall revert back to the general fund and will be available for other social services to be identified by the local Sangunian.

The LGU shall submit to the National DRRM Council its monthly statement on the utilization of DRRM funds and make an accounting thereof in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules.

**SECTION 10. REPEALING CLAUSE.** –All other executive issuances which are inconsistent with or contrary to the provision of this Executive Order are hereby amended or repealed accordingly.

**SECTION 11. EFFECTIVITY.** This Executive Order shall take effect upon approval.
