#### EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 020-2016

AN ORDER RECONSTITUTING THE MUNICIPAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL, DEFINING ITS FUNCTIONS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121 also known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 (An Act strengthening the Philippine disaster risk reduction and management system, providing for the National disaster risk reduction and management framework and institutionalizing the national disaster risk reduction and management plan, appropriating funds therefore and for other purposes) provides for the creation of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC) in every local government unit;

**WHEREAS,** Executive Order No.23-2013 issued during the previous administration created the MDRRMC of the Municipality of Pinamalayan and there is currently a pressing need to reorganized the Council following the recent election last May which set forth for a new administration;

**WHEREAS,** realizing and preparing for the potential great risks brought by climate change, this new leadership recognizes and supports the vital role of this Council in keeping up with DRRM issues and concerns;

**WHEREAS**, cognizant of the need to ensure that local policies, plans, programs and projects are founded upon sound environmental considerations and adopts the principle of sustainable development, policy is hereby declared to systematically integrate the concept of climate change in various phases of policy formulation, development tools and techniques by all offices of the local government;

**NOW THEREFORE**, I, **ARISTEO A. BALDOS**, **JR**., Municipal Mayor by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order; as follows:

**SECTION 1. Scope**. The Executive Order provides for the development of policies and plans and the implementation of action and measures pertaining to all aspect of disaster risk reduction and management, including good governance, risk assessment and early warning, knowledge building and awareness raising, reducing underlying risk factor, and preparedness for effective response and early recovery.

SECTION 2. Organizing the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council. The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council is hereby reorganized to be constituted as follows:

**SECTION 3. Duties and Functions**. The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council shall have the following functions:

- Approve, monitor and evaluate the implementation of the Municipal DRRM Plans and regularly review and test the plan consistent with other national and local planning programs;
- (2) Ensure the integration and disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation into local development plans, programs and budgets as a strategy in sustainable development and poverty reduction;
- (3) Recommend the implementation of force or preemptive evacuation of local residents, if necessary; and
- (4) Convene the local council once every three months or as necessary.

SECTION 4. Accreditation, Mobilization, and Protection of Disaster Volunteers and National Service Reserve Corps, CSOs and the Private Sector. The municipal government may mobilize individuals or organized volunteers to augment their respective personnel complement and logistical requirements in the delivery of disaster risk reduction programs and activities. The municipal government shall take full responsibility for the enhancement, welfare and protection of volunteers, and shall submit the list of volunteers to the OCD, through the Local DRRM Office, for accreditation and inclusion in the database of community disaster volunteers. Accreditation shall be done at the municipal level.

Mobilization of volunteers shall be in accordance with the guidelines to be formulated by the National Disaster Risk reduction Management Council consistent with the provisions of RA 10121. Any volunteer who incurs death or injury while engaged in any of the activities defined under the Act shall be entitled to compensatory benefits and individual personnel accident insurance as may be defined under the guidelines.

SECTION 5. Integration of Disaster Risk Reduction Education into the School Curricula and Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Programs and Mandatory Training for the Public Sector Employees. The DepED, CHED, TESDA, in coordination with OCD, the National Youth Commission (NYC), the DOST, the DENR, the DILGBFP, the DOH,

The DSWD and other relevant agencies, shall integrate disaster risk reduction and management education in the school curricula of secondary and tertiary level of education, including National Service Training Program, (NSTP), whether private or public, including formal and non-formal, technical-

vocational, indigenous learning, and out-of-school youth courses and programs.

The Local DRRM Council, the Local DRRM Office, the Barangay Disaster Coordinating Committees and Sangguniang Kabataan shall encourage community, specifically youth, participation in the disaster risk reduction and management activities, such as organizing quick response groups, particularly in identified disaster-prone areas,

as well as the inclusion of disaster risk reduction and management programs as part of the SK programs and projects.

The public sector employees shall be trained in emergency response and preparedness. The training is mandatory for such employees for such employees to comply with the provisions of RA 10121.

- **SECTION 6.** Coordination During Emergencies. The Municipal DRRM Council shall take the lead in the preparing for, responding to, and recovering from the effect of the disaster when two (2) or more barangays are affected;
- **SECTION 7.** Declaration of State of Calamity. The declaration and lifting of the state of calamity may also be issued by the local Sanggunian, upon the recommendation of the Municipal DRRM Council, based on the results of the damage assessment and needs analysis.
- **SECTION 8.** Remedial Measures. The declaration of the calamity shall make mandatory the immediate undertaking of the following remedial measures by the member-offices/agencies concerned as defined in R.A. 10121;
- (a) Imposition of price ceiling on basic necessities and prime commodities by the President upon recommendation of the Implementing agency as provided for under Republic Act 7581, otherwise known as the Price Act or the National Price coordinating Council;
- (b) Monitoring, prevention and control by the Local Price Coordination Council of overpricing/profiteering and hoarding of prime commodities, medicines, and petroleum products;
- (c) Programming/ reprogramming of funds for the repair and safety upgrading of public infrastructure and facilities; and
  - (a) Granting of no-interest loans by government financing or lending institutions to the most affected section of the population through their cooperative or people's organization.

SECTION 9. Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund. The present Calamity Fund shall henceforth be known as the Municipal Disaster Risk
Reduction and Management Fund. Not less than five percent (5%) of the estimated
revenue from regular sources shall be set aside as the Municipal Disaster Risk
Reduction Management Fund to support disaster risk management activities such as,
but not limited to, pre-disaster preparedness programs including training, purchasing
life-saving rescue equipment, supplies and medicines, for post-disaster activities, and

for the payment of premiums on calamity insurance. The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council shall monitor and evaluate the use and disbursement of Municipal DRRM Fund based on the Municipal DRRM Plan as incorporated in the local development plans and annual work and financial plan.

Upon the recommendation of the Municipal DRRM Officer and approval of the Sanggunian, the Municipal DRRM Council may transfer the said fund to support disaster risk reduction work of other Municipal DRRM which is declared under state of calamity.

Of the amount appropriated for Municipal DRRM Fund, thirty percent (30%) shall be allocated as Quick Response Fund (QRF) or stand-by fund for relief and recovery programs in order that situation and living conditions of people in communities or areas stricken by disasters, calamities, epidemics, or complex emergencies, may be normalized as quickly as possible.

Unexpended Municipal DRRM Fund shall accrue to a special trust fund solely for the purpose of supporting disaster risk reduction and management activities of the Local DRRM Council within the next five (5) years. Any such amount still not fully utilized after (5) years shall revert back to the general fund and will be available for other social services to be identified by the local Sanggunian.

The LGU shall submit to the National DRRM Council its monthly statement on the utilization of DRRM Funds and make an accounting thereof in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules.

**SECTION 10.** Repealing Clause. - All other executive issuances which are inconsistent with or contrary to the provision of this Executive Order are hereby amended or repealed accordingly.

**SECTION 11.** Effectivity Clause. - This Executive Order shall take effect upon approval.
